"To be involved when people make decisions which affect our lives."

"To have services that value our different backgrounds, culture, religion, race and sexuality."

"To have support that enables young carers to choose how much caring we do." "To be listened to."

"To not be bullied."

"To have a childhood."

"To have a wide range of information that would help us."

"To have a safe environment and protection from harm, including any harm that our caring roles could cause us."
